

Plastic Canvas Bookmarks

Continental Stitch Bookmark

(Plastic Canvas is 9 holes wide by 45 holes long)

Materials Needed:

Plastic Canvas Needle

1 Plastic Canvas Piece 9 holes wide by 45 holes long

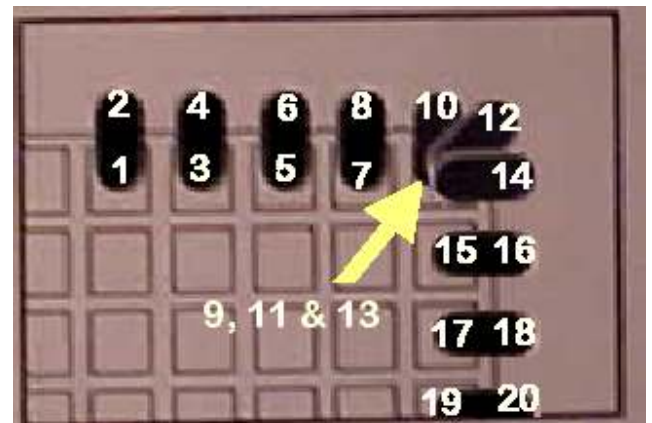
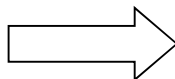
Yarn: approximately 1½ yds for Continental stitch & 1 yd for Over Casting

1. Bring threaded needle **UP** from the back at 1 and all ODD numbers and **DOWN** from the front at 2 and all EVEN numbers.
2. Thread plastic canvas needle with about 20 inches of yarn
3. When you begin, leave a "tail" about 1 inch on the back. You will work this under the other stitches when you need to rethread your needle.
4. Follow the diagram below, and repeat steps 1 – 32 until entire bookmark is covered with Continental Stitches.
5. Thread needle with 20 inches of yarn and finish the edges around the bookmark with an Over Cast stitch (see instructions for Over Cast Stitch below).
6. Remember never CUT your yarn when you run out. Work the yarn under 4 or more stitches on the back, then cut the yarn and rethread your needle.



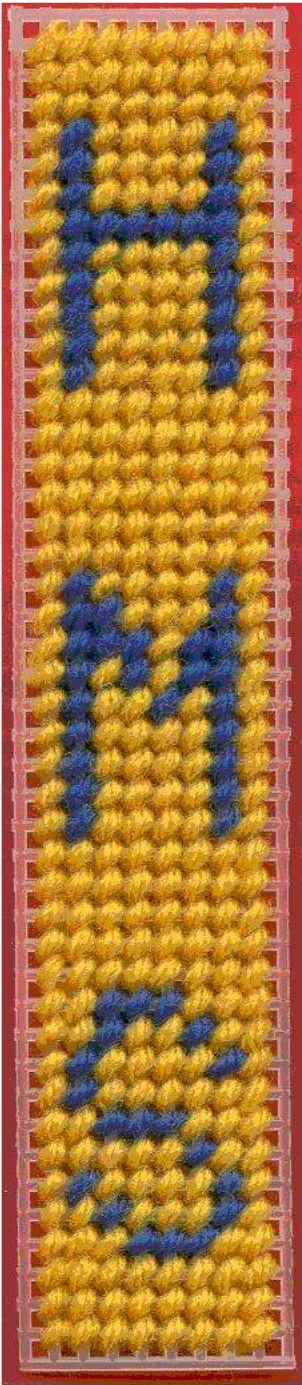
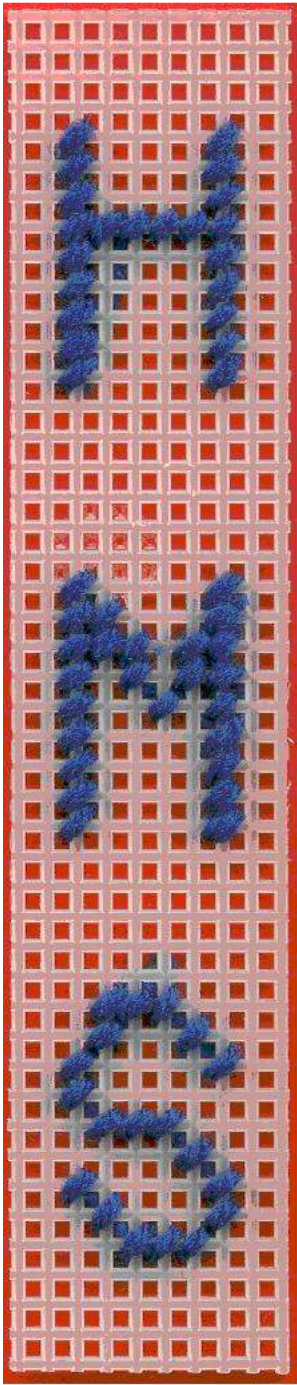
Over Cast Stitch

- This stitch covers the edge of the canvas and/or joins pieces of canvas.
- Go through the same hole more than once to get an even coverage on the corners (see stitches 9, 11 & 13)



HMS Bookmarks

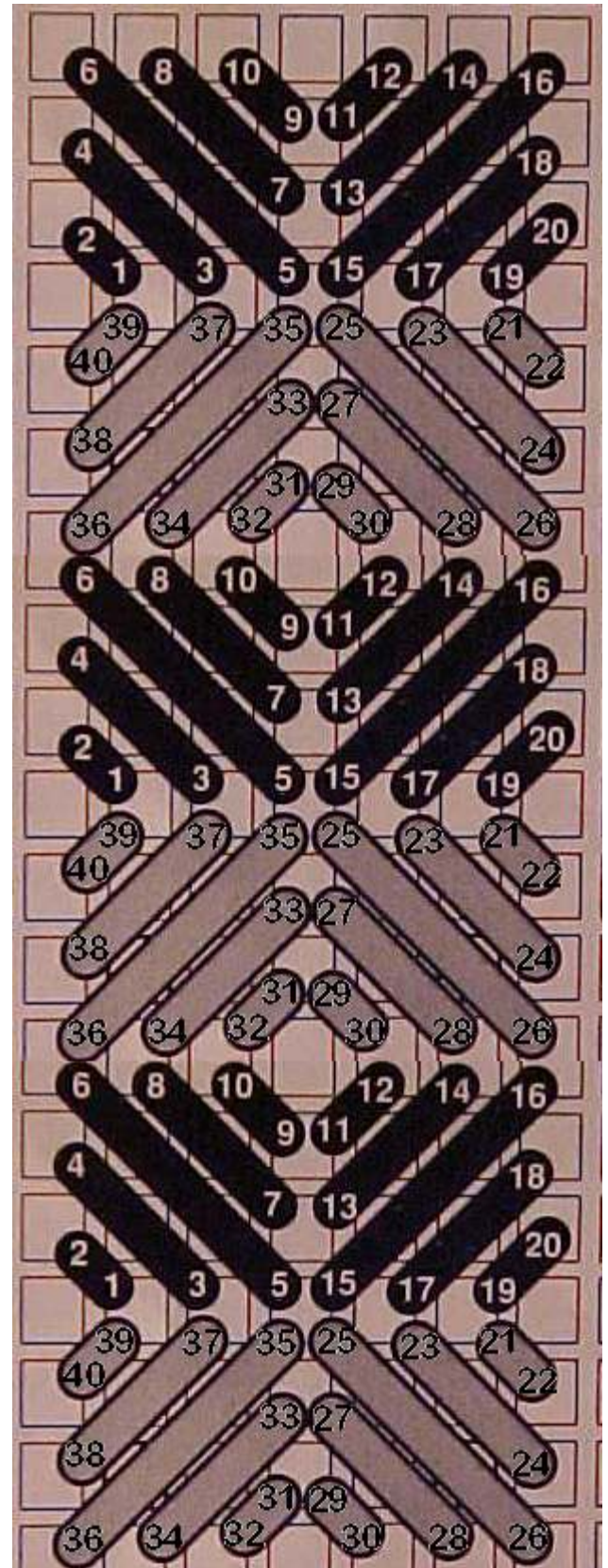
9w x 45h holes (Use Lettering 6)



Plastic Canvas: **ALTERNATING SCOTCH STITCH BOOK MARK**

(Plastic Canvas is 7 holes wide by 42 holes long)

1. Unless otherwise indicated, bring threaded needle UP from the back at 1 and all ODD numbers and DOWN from the front at 2 and all EVEN numbers.
 2. Thread plastic canvas needle with about 18 inches of yarn.
 3. When you begin, leave a "tail" about 1 inch on the back, you will work this under the other stitches when you need to rethread your needle.
 4. Follow the diagram on the right, and repeat steps 1 – 40 until entire bookmark is covered with Alternating Scotch Stitches.
 5. Thread needle with 18 inches of yarn and finish the edges around the bookmark with an over cast stitch.
- Remember never just CUT your yarn when you run out. Work the yarn under 4 or more stitches on the back, then cut the yarn and rethread your needle.
