

# ***Beginner's Single Crochet Scarf***

## **Materials:**

5 oz 4-ply worsted weight yarn  
Crochet hook size H, I or J  
Large-eye yarn needle

**Finished Size:** approximately 5 inches wide x 55 inches long (not including fringes)

**Gauge** is not important in this pattern because scarves come in many different widths.

## **Abbreviations:**

ch = chain  
chs = chains  
ea = each

sc = single crochet  
st = stitch

**To Begin:** Chain 15.

**Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in ea of next 13 chs (for a total of 14 sc), ch 1 & turn.

**Row 2:** Sc in 2nd sc from hook, sc in ea sc across (total of 13 sc), then ch 1, to turn.

To keep your **scarf edges even**, count the number of sc you do. You need 13 sc for each row.

**Repeat row 2** until the scarf is 55 inches long or desired length.

Cut the yarn off leaving about 8 inches. Pull the cut end of the yarn through the final loop that is left on the hook. Thread the yarn end onto the needle and weave the needle under stitches for at least three inches. Pull the yarn through and cut off the extra yarn.

**Fringes:** Add 5" fringe to the scarf by cutting 10-inch lengths of yarn, folded in half. Add 3 fringes to each single crochet stitch on each end (total of 28 fringes).
